Tours are usually about an hour, we ask nothing from the homeowner except to let us enjoy, and are usually a Thursday evening but we can accommodate changes.

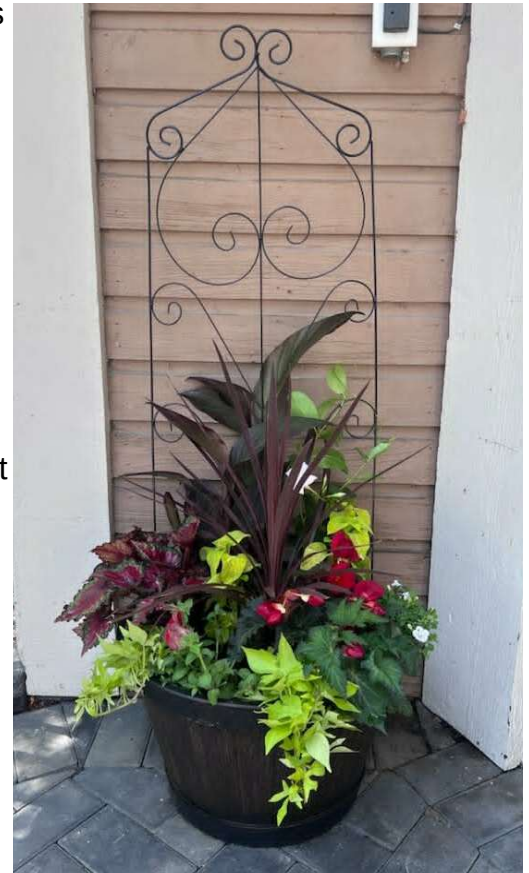
If you know of a garden and would like an ice-breaker, we have these cards available:

Thank you and welcome to all the new members! We are about 75 members now, and that's fantastic! To keep up with the rising costs of venue rent, insurance, guest speakers, and our various club events, we have made the decision to implement a \$5 Drop-In fee for non-members attending our meetings. This change will take effect starting with the March meeting and will continue in the future. We appreciate your ongoing support and understanding as we work to maintain the quality of our club's programming. Fees are \$20 per person/year for membership.
